- Explaining why we do things the way we do
- Listening to students views
- Being organised

### Responsibility

Everyone has a responsibility to contribute to a positive, enjoyable and safe learning environment for all.

What this might mean for you:

- Helping other people
- Listening and following instructions
- Looking after equipment

What this might mean for Stokehill staff:

- Preparing sessions that enable learning
- Showing students how to carry or use the equipment
- Advising students how to move around site e.g. not running in certain places
- Ensuring clarity in the instructions that are given
- Ensuring students are informed of significant risks

## **Rights**

Everyone has a right to learn in a safe, inclusive and fair environment.  
What this might mean for you:

- Following your organisation's rules
- Asking questions if you don't understand
- Participating and contributing to sessions

What this might mean for Stokehill staff:

- Knowing the activity and field sites well
- Explaining things a different way
- Having appropriate training e.g. first aid
